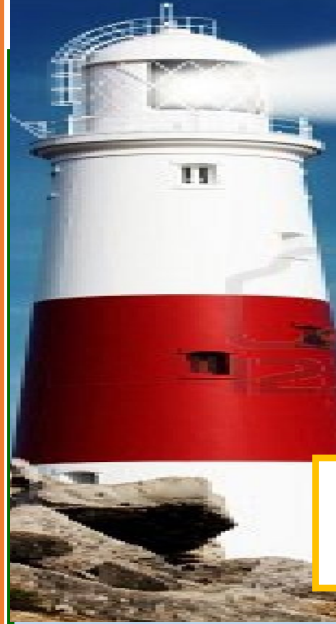

Dear Parents/Carers

We can hardly believe that there are only three weeks of the half term left! Where has that time gone? You should be so proud of your children and yourselves as you have all adapted and are working so positively with the school. We know that the drop off and pick up is different; we know that finding your way around the site is not always easy; we know that remembering where your child's class is, who your child's teacher is and all the other things that, as parents, you have to remember on a daily basis, but you are doing it brilliantly and all in the eye of a pandemic.

I thought it would be good to share those things that we have achieved over the partial school closure and are continuing to work on as we progress into the Autumn Term. We now have a refurbished school with all classrooms decorated and, where needed or possible, new furniture, lights and carpets have been bought. It has really made a difference to our learning environment and impacts positively on the children.

We are now engaging with Cornwall's Education Library service and our library has been re-stocked with new books, ready to excite and engage the children's enthusiasm. We are not yet able to use it as we would like but we know that when we are able, the children will hugely benefit from being able to choose from a range of titles. The Library Service will be visiting us once again at half term and will be bringing yet more books for our children to enjoy, as well as the library van visiting next half term.

In the Wildlife Area planting has taken place alongside the fence and we hope, in a short space of time, it will disguise the buildings and create a green space in which the children can feel immersed in Nature.

The free flow area outside of our YR classes continues to be developed and the next stage of the project is to be actioned including more planting, a cover for the sand tray and easily accessible storage areas. We are determined to keep this area as natural as possible so the children can let their imaginations run riot and learn to play freely.

The grassed area near Y3/4 playground has been levelled and re-planted, the porta-cabins on the field taken away and a space is being created for class gardens and a running track has been laid on the field.

The next stage is the development of the Y1 outside area so the classrooms become inside and out and are more suitable environments for our younger children to learn.

In addition to this we are also working hard on developing an exciting curriculum with topics that hook the interests of our children. We continue to secure the basics in quality first teaching in English and Maths with appropriate resources that encourage the children to practise key skills.

I hope you can see we are busy, that Rosemellin School is continuing on its developmental journey and we are continuing to be excited by what lies ahead.

### **A change to the drop off and pick up times**

We are proposing a change to the start and end of our days. Now that everyone is used to the routine, know where they are going and are following the entry on to the site and exit from the site, not using the Cliff View Road gate, we think it's time to make a change.

We will be reducing drop off and pick up to 15 mins. Drop off can take place between 8.45 - 9.00 a.m and pick up will be between 3.00 and 3.15 p.m.
