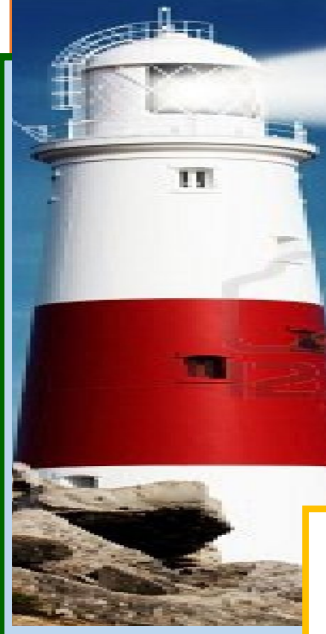

WE ARE A CASHLESS SYSTEM AND MONEY NEEDS TO BE PAID ONLINE

Please make sure your child's dinner money account is topped up with credit at the beginning of the week.

Please let the office know if you are having problems logging into your school money account.

We can send you a reminder password or print a barcode for you to pay cash at a pay point if preferred.

If your child is in arrears you will need to provide them with a packed lunch.

HOW IT WORKS:

In the morning your child will order a school dinner at registration time. When they collect it from the canteen they will be marked off on the dinner list. The office will deduct £2.20 from their account.

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals / Pupil Premium funding please contact the office.

DINNER MONEY NEEDS TO BE TOPPED UP FOR THE WEEK AHEAD. IF YOUR DINNER MONEY ACCOUNT IS IN DEBT OF MORE THAN £11.00 YOU WILL NEED TO PROVIDE YOUR CHILD WITH A PACKED LUNCH.

FOUNDATION GATE: By the main reception.

MAIN GATE: Cliff View Road gate leading onto Y5/6 playground **PLEASE DO NOT EXIT VIA THIS GATE**

YOU MAY EXIT VIA THE GATE TO THE STAFF CAR PARK.

TOP FIELD GATE: Roskear lane gate leading onto Y3/4 Playground

Dear Parents/Carers



I hope you are all keeping well and as safe as you can in these very, very strange times. The week has flown and still the children are responding very well to their return to school.

It is interesting that, in order to keep safe and keep to our planning and risk assessments, it is giving us an opportunity to review long established practices. In some cases, we are introducing new ways of doing things that, as regards efficiency and effectiveness, far outweigh what has gone before.

The school's English leader, Mr Cromey, has been trialling an on-line reading form which makes gathering the responses from parents and the checking of whether children have read, so much easier. This practice has now been rolled out across the school and we are getting very positive responses from parents. However, if there is a difficulty, if the technology is a barrier, please, please let the class teacher know so we can overcome it together.

We are prioritising Reading, Writing and Maths to ensure any gaps in the children's knowledge and understanding are plugged as quickly as possible. We know there are many things that take children's interest and that, perhaps, it is not always easy to encourage them to read every evening. However, it is the thing that will make the real difference to the children's learning and, without being able to read easily and quickly, the rest of the curriculum becomes that much more difficult.
