

This Week's Spotlight is on—the Curriculum

As a school we have put a huge amount of time and hard work into ensuring our curriculum is fit for purpose and meets the needs of our learning community, our children. Our curriculum focuses on getting children off to a flying start as soon as they join our school with an emphasis on extending a child's vocabulary and teaching them to read.

We know how important it is to ensure our children are numerate, enjoy learning about number and problem solving and learn automaticity and fluency in the basic number operations of adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. We place great emphasis on children learning their tables as we know how important this is in securing success in mathematics.

Our curriculum plan for each half term focuses on Geography, History or Science and these subjects form the main links for the other foundation subjects. Subject leaders have carefully mapped their subject across the academic year, and across the year groups ensuring our children have time to build on what they have learnt before, know what is coming next and how that fits into what is being taught in the future.

Teachers focus on outcomes in each subject, building on small steps so that the children's knowledge is built sequentially and progressively. Subject leaders are busy and working hard on ensuring they review the curriculum, are looking at what is in our children's books and speaking to the children to find out what they know and understand.

In order to help parents know what we are teaching in each subject, a whole school curriculum map has been added to our website detailing the small steps in Geography/History/Science: there are also half term maps. We hope you find them interesting and helpful in helping you support your child's learning. Subject leaders will be adding more information as the year progresses.
