



Week 2– Home Learning Menu– EYFS



Our theme this week is...

Castles!

Starters

Science: Create a weather diary for each day– draw a picture of what the weather looks like and then write a simple sentence describing the weather. Use the sentence stem: *The weather today is....*

Computing: Draw a picture of a castle using 'Paint' on the computer. What colours will you use? How will you use the computer mouse to draw the castle?

Geography: Find out some facts about a castle anywhere in the world. Was the castle used as a home or as a means of protection? What are the key features of the castle?

Main Course

English: Watch Alphablocks (found on Cbeebies, YouTube, BBC iPlayer)- this will support your child with their letter sounds and with blending and segmenting words for reading and spelling.

Create a fact file for the castle you did research about. Write a sentence or two with the facts you know! Don't forget to draw a picture of the castle.

Maths: Watch Numberblocks (found on Cbeebies, YouTube, BBC iPlayer)- particularly episodes with numbers up to 20, halving, doubling, more and less, counting in 2's, 5's, 10's. Look around the house and find 5 objects– order them from longest to shortest.

Find different packets of food. Which one is the heaviest/ lightest? Can you order them from heaviest to lightest?

Go on a number hunt around the house. What numbers can you find?

Art: Using materials from around your house or your garden create a collage of a castle. Think about the colours you will use– will you use all the same colours? Or will you use different colours?

DT: Using junk materials, build a castle! Think about how you will decorate your castle. Can you use paint to add extra details?

Dessert

Speaking and Listening: Discuss the model castle you have made with your family. Can you talk through what you did? Can you explain the key features? Can you explain why it is a good, strong castle?

Moving and Handling: Practice your control with a ball– can you push it? Can you throw it? Can you catch it? Can you kick it? Practice your balance– can you balance on one leg?
