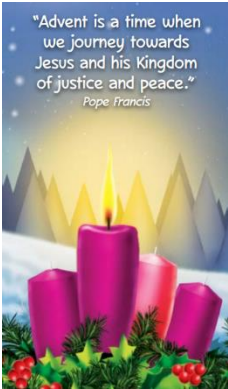

Academy Food Bank

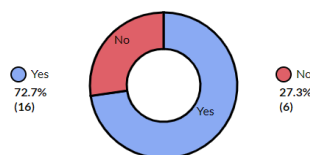
