

Autumn Term 2 2018 Curriculum

Maths

We will continue with addition and subtraction, learning strategies and methods to help solve them. Y1 will focus on finding up to 10 more and less than a number whilst Year 2 will be working with two 2-digit numbers.

We will begin to look at multiplication and division with focus being on the 2x 3x 5x 10x tables.

Pine class will also be familiarizing themselves with different denominations of money.

Science

Changing Shape

- Exploring materials and their properties
- Squashing, stretching, bending and twisting to make new shapes

English

Pine class will begin with WW1 diary writing using their evacuee boxes.

We will then focus on the story, 'The Dragon Machine' and write our own stories about dragons living amongst us!

There will be a huge emphasis on speaking and listening skills this term as all children develop their performance skills for the nativity.
