

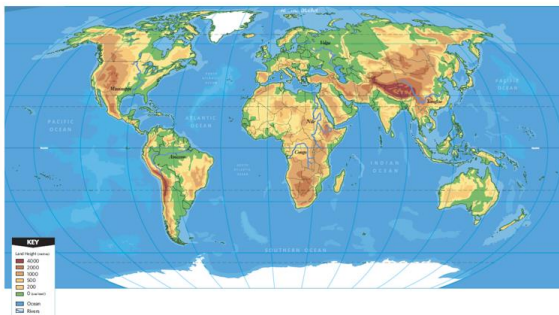

Continent	Continent One of the world's seven main areas of land
Country	Country A nation with its own government
Desert	A desert is any large region that gets very little rain each year.
Mountain	Large landform that rises above its surrounding land
Mount Everest	Highest mountain in the world
tributaries	When one stream meets another and they merge together, the smaller stream is known as a tributary
River	A river is a flowing, moving stream of water. Usually a river feeds water into an ocean, lake, pond, or even another river.
Glaciers	large area of thick ice that remains frozen from one year to the next. Glaciers also slowly flow over the land.
