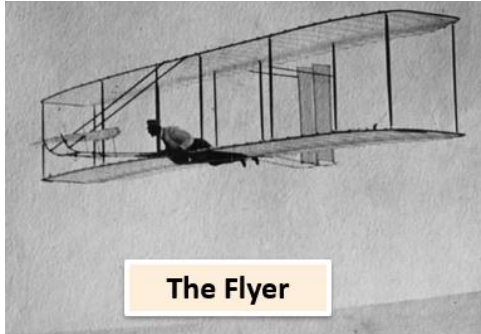

## Key Vocabulary

aviation	the flying, designing and making of an <b>aircraft</b>
Commem - orate	remember something and by doing so to honour it
freight	goods or <b>cargo</b> carried by a ship, train, truck, or airplane
trade	the business of buying and selling or bartering commodities
leisure	<b>Examples</b> of <b>leisure</b> activities are bicycling, bowling, curling, horseback riding, golfing, hiking/walking, skating, skiing and swimming
inventor	An <b>inventor</b> is a person who has <b>invented</b> something
Victorian era	the <b>period</b> of Queen <b>Victoria's</b> reign, from 20 June 1837 until her death on 22 January 1901
