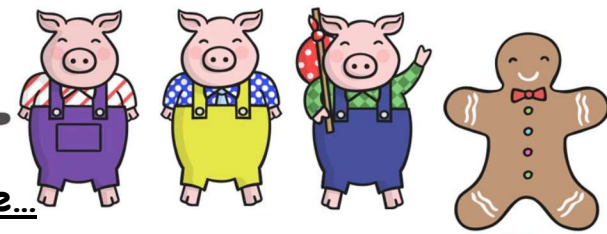







Spring 1 - Home Learning Challenges - Once upon a time...

<p>Make a sock puppet of your favourite fairy tale character.</p> 	<p>Which fairy tale character would you most like to be and why? Can you draw a picture of them?</p>	<p>How many different fairy tales at you can think of! Which ones do you like the most?</p> 	<p>Research a fairy tale that you have not heard before. What was it about? Did you enjoy it? Why or why not?</p> 
<p>Fairy tales used to be told through word of mouth, rather than books. Can you tell a story in this way? Perhaps an adult would like to record you and post this on Tapestry?</p> 	<p>Practise singing some counting songs with your family. Here are some ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 5 little ducks</li> <li>- 1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive</li> <li>- 10 in the bed</li> <li>- 5 little speckled frogs</li> <li>- 10 green bottles</li> <li>- 5 little men in a flying saucer.</li> </ul>	<p>Use junk modelling to make a building from a fairy tale. It could be a tower, a castle, a bridge or a house.</p> 	<p>The man had 9 magic beans. He gave 4 of them to Jack. How many beans did the man have left?</p> <p>You could draw some pictures, use some objects or use your fingers to help you.</p>
