When is homework due in?

What homework will my child be set?

Every Friday, new homework will be set for the week. This includes:

Where can I access my child's login information?

All of the login information your child needs will be laminated and given to your child as a bookmark.

What is the expectation for homework?

How often does my child need to read at home?

Every child is expected to read at home 5 times per week.

What books should my child be reading?

Every child will be given a reading book at the appropriate level which they can take home. In addition to this, they may also wish to read their own books materials from home.

How should I record how often my child has read?

All reading should be recorded in your child's reading record which will be checked every Friday. If a child reads 5 times or more, they will earn a Dojo.

How often is my child's reading level assessed?

Times Table Rockstars – 25 mins per week (this could be done in short bursts of 5 mins each) SpellingFrame - 25 mins per week (this could be done in short bursts of 5 mins each)

Your child's reading level will be assessed every term and note of this will be made in the child's reading record.

What if my child needs to change their reading book?

The class will be given time every Friday to change their reading books but can do so earlier in the week if necessary. Changing their book is the child's responsibility.

Rewards and Sanctions

Class Dojo

Children can earn Dojos for being good role models and demonstrating our school behaviours of Positivity, Appreciation, Courtesy, On Task, Respect & Kindness. Dojos are tracked using an online app which is shared with the children throughout the school day. Texts will be sent to parents when a child shows examples of outstanding behaviour.

Children can also lose Dojos when they break or disregard these behaviours:

Step 1. Verbal warning. Step 2. Loose a Dojo. Step 3. Miss playtime & speak to Headteacher + parents informed

Frequenly Asked Questions

When does my child need their PE kit?

Due to the current restrictions placed on schools due to the Covid-19 outbreak, children will need to wear their PE kits into school on the day they have PE. In term 1, Year 4 will need to wear their PE kit into school every Friday. They may wish to wear tracksuit bottoms, leggings or hoodies in cold weather.

What stationary should my child bring to school?

Things to focus on on Y4

Times Tables & Number Bonds

By the end of Year 4, children should be able to confidently recall their times tables to 12. Having a secure knowledge of their times tables and also number bonds to 20, will be



extremely beneficial when learning new concepts introduced as they move into Upper KS2.

Spelling

Key spelling rules will be set for homework each week but the Year 3/4 statutory spellings are also really useful to practise at home.

- Termly assessments for reading, writing and maths.
- Weekly informal arithmetic and spelling tests.
- Statutory Multiplication Tables Check. This
 happens during the summer term and is
 completed online and will last around 5
 minute. Children will be given six seconds to
 answer each of the 25 questions, with a three
 second blank gap between each question.
