- Using Google Earth (<https://earth.google.com>) find the UK and then your house. Next find China on the globe. What do you notice about the size of the country? Zoom in and try and look at some of the different areas. What do you notice? Does it look like where you live? How is it the same from where you live? How is it different?
- What can you find out about the day in the life of a child in China? Make a diary for your own day, thinking about what you might do at different times. Then, after you have done some research, write a diary for a child in China. Think about what we found out about Liu Jiasi living with her Mum and Dad in Beijing. Do you remember what we read about Tao Kui living in the farming village and walking the water buffaloes to the water?
- Try making some decorations for Chinese New Year. How are they the same as decorations we might have for a celebration? How are the decorations different? Take some photos as we would love to see your decorations when we get back to school.
