

Ashfield Nursery School Action Early Years Pupil Premium Plan - September 2018-19

From April 2015 we were able to claim extra Government funding for some of our 3 and 4 year olds in the Nursery school to support their development, learning and care. This funding is called the Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP).

The Early Years Pupil Premium provides us with an extra 53pence per hour for 3&4 year old children whose parents are in receipt of certain benefits or who have been in care or adopted from care. This means an extra £302 per year for each child taking up the full 15 hours per week funded entitlement to early education. It is well known that high quality early education can influence how well a child does both in primary and secondary school so we do want to make the most of the additional funding

Across the year we expect on average approximately 35 children eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium.

We expect to receive approximately £9,000.00 this academic year

Barriers to Learning
Low attainment on entry especially in areas of Maths and Literacy
Lower attainment on entry and larger gap between them and non EYPP children in the aspect of 'speaking' and 'numbers' and area of 'physical development'
Lower attendance levels for some children in receipt of EYPP
