

Blended Learning Expectations Y1-Y6

Dear Parent/Carer

The government's expectation has shifted from the previous lock-down in March (which was ensuring childcare) to now ensuring schools are continuing to provide challenging learning opportunities. The government is very clear that all children are required to carry out daily learning. As such, at Roskear we will expect all children to engage with either in school, online or paper learning provided by school daily. As we all know, teacher input, modelling and feedback are vital to pupils understanding and making progress and as such our online learning this lockdown will be very different from March.

As before, our primary source of communication is via eSchools. In addition to this, all pupils will be receiving regular phone-calls from members of staff to help and assist with their home learning. Those children who do not engage with the home learning (online or paper based) will be contacted to establish why they are absent from 'school'.

KS1 and KS2 Timetable

To minimize disruption and ensure good learning habits, it is suggested that where possible pupils follow the timetable below (which mirrors a typical school day). However, depending on personal circumstances we understand that the order or duration of lessons may change.

Online Learning

Unlike previously, it is now a requirement that every child register every day, by midday, via their class eSchools page. Depending on the age of your child, you may need to do this for them.

Teachers will be providing a pre-record welcome message for pupils everyday informing them of:

- The expectation and learning for the day and the times that they will be available to answer any learning questions. They may also direct questions to the children as a class, group or individual level.

Pupils must upload their learning everyday on their class eSchools page for their teacher. This could be:

- A photo of the work completed in the exercise books provided in their home learning packs sent home last term.
- Completed learning as a Word or PDF document which can be uploaded to eSchools.

- Answers sent/uploaded directly to the eSchools platform (dependent on the type of learning set). It may be that children can type out their answers directly on to the eSchools' homework project set for that day.

Teachers will be available every morning to respond to pupils, mark work and feedback (they will be live and present at the yellow shaded times on the timetable). HLTAs will be responding to messages in the afternoon as teachers will be marking and recording the following day's teaching.

As we will still have classes in school, the following teachers will be the ones delivering the online learning:

Offline

For those families choosing to complete off-line (paper based such as the sent home CGP books) learning they must follow the 6 week plan for English and Maths which directs pupils to the pages within their CGP books to complete. They should record their learning in the exercise books provided and bring these back as evidence of their learning at the end of lock-down. Children should also complete topic learning in the afternoon which can be found on the school website.

These pupils will be called regularly throughout the week by a member of staff to talk through the learning that has been completed, mark the learning and answer any questions. It will therefore be essential that your child complete their learning every day.
