

New Behaviour Policy

In September we introduced a new Behaviour Policy which was written over the Summer and ratified by the Governing Body last week.

The expectations of children have not changed, nor have the school rules:

- Be kind and caring to everyone
- Always try your best in everything you do
- Respect yourself, other people and our school
- Listen carefully, answer politely and do what you are asked at the first time of asking
- Always come to school on time with the right equipment

There are clear consequences in place for children not adhering to the rules and discussions with parents will take place where children are persistently making the wrong choices.

There is a new focus on 'Restorative Practices' so that children can focus on making the right choices, being responsible for their own actions and developing a better understanding of the impact of their actions. This is especially useful where there are incidents between children on the playground. The questions that we use are:

1. What happened?
2. What were you thinking about at the time?
3. What have your thoughts been since the incident?
4. Who do you think has been affected by your actions? In what way were they affected?
5. What do you need to do now to make things right?

Flo's mum and little sister Phoebe took part and many of the participants were either in fancy dress or bright rainbow clothes which made for a cheerful sight!


