WE NEED YOUR HELP

As part of our role in keeping children safe, **we must see or hear from the children weekly**. All classes run class Zoom sessions – please ensure your child 'attends' each week. Contact your child's class teacher using the phase emails underneath the school calendar if you need further information on Zoom meetings.

If your child is not on the class Zoom **their teacher will contact you to speak to your child**. It is imperative that your child is seen or heard each week, so please do answer the calls, which are often from a number being withheld.

Key Worker Provision

You may be aware that the number of pupils using key worker provision in schools is far higher than during the first lockdown, which makes mitigating risks more challenging in school. We remain here to support key workers wherever needed but in line with Government guidance, **we ask that you support your children at home wherever it is safely possible to do**. Thank you.

Drop Off, Collection, Social Distancing and Face Coverings

If your child has been offered a place in school, we would like to remind you that we will be maintaining the one-way system around school as this allows for social distancing. Classroom doors will now open from **8:40am** and close at 8:50am.

The school day now ends at **3:10pm**.

What is the time commitment required?

Being a Trustee involves a combination of the following:

- attending meetings – usually a minimum of 6 a year
- reading papers in advance of meetings / responding to emails
- sign up to a code of conduct and to follow a set of principles for public life (*“the Nolan Principles”*)

During the current pandemic meetings are being held virtually and we expect this to become part of how governance at Crofty works in the future.

How does governance actually work?

Governance works in partnership with all the Trust's employees (teachers, classroom assistants, support staff, managers) to deliver the best outcomes for every pupil and their families, through outstanding teaching and providing first class facilities.

The main responsibilities are:

- set the strategic leadership and direction for all the schools
- monitor finances and ensure public money is well spent
- ensure the Trust complies with legal requirements and is managed effectively
- achieves the best possible outcomes for every child

What does a Trustee do?

Trustees are collectively 'the Board' and are the statutory body ultimately responsible to the government for how the Trust operates. They focus on 'the big picture' and the responsibilities listed above.

If you are interested in helping introduce and manage change in a large multi-site organisation then this could be the role for you. Knowledge and experience of the challenging world of education would be welcome – but is not essential.

Particular skill sets we are looking for include:

- HR
- Change and project management
- Marketing
- IT
