Super Spelling Stars (SSS)

Parents may be aware that children in Key Stage 2 have started working to be Super Spelling Stars. This works in a similar way to Terrific Times Tables, where children work through levels (up to level 20) They need to spell all the words in one level correctly in order to move up to the next one. The initiative has been created by Susannah Howard and covers all the words/ rules that children are expected to know whilst at primary school. By the end of Year 6 we hope all children will have reached level 20. We are having a big push on spelling at the moment so please do encourage your children to learn their spellings and reach the next level.
