



St. Cuthbert's RC Primary School

Key Stage 2 Assessment Data 2016

In 2016, the new more challenging national curriculum, which was introduced in 2014, was assessed by new tests and interim frameworks for teacher assessment. Results are no longer reported as levels: each pupil receives their test results as a scaled score and teacher assessments based on the standards in the interim framework. (Pupils must achieve a scaled score of 100 in order to attain the expected standard).

Nationally, 53% of pupils reached the new expected standard in all of reading, writing and maths. (See below).

The 2016 key stage assessments are the first which assess the new, more challenging national curriculum which was introduced in 2014. The expected standard has also been raised higher than the old Level 4. As a result, figures for 2016 are not comparable to those for earlier years.
