Class News

Menabilly Class

This week our learning has focused around the story Supertato!

We have used our senses to investigate different vegetables, we have come up with amazing plans to help free the vegetables captured in the story and we have begun planning and designing traps that we can use to catch the Evil Pea!

In maths our focus for this week and next is addition. We have been combining two groups of objects together carefully counting how many we have altogether.

Next week, children will be creating their own story books to write their stories into along with their own illustrations and front cover. We will also be recapping and extending skills of using correct punctuation and grammar in independent writing.

In maths we will be learning calculation methods to solve subtracting 1 and 2 digit numbers from 2 and 3 digit numbers using a number line and the column method.

In P.E, children have been learning the skills and rules involved in playing hockey. Please can all children have their correct, full P,E kit in school every day- particularly Wednesdays to avoid missing out.


Year 5 have produced some fantastic writing for their articles about the sinking of the Bismarck and nearly all of the children are ready to write their article onto their newspaper front pages next week.


In topic we have been focused on rationing, learning about what was rationed and why. We will start to move onto evacuation next week





Years Rec - 6 in classrooms

Timings of the School Day

A reminder about school start and finish time- pupils must be in class by 8.55 if children arrive later than this the doors will be closed and pupils will need to come through the main entrance and will be marked as late on the register, if a pupil is later than 9.20 this will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

What attendance is Good attendance?

It is vital that pupils attend school, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education. **95%** - 100% (less than 10 days absence in a year) is good attendance. **96%** is the national average attendance rate for a child at primary school.

Why is Good attendance Important?

The **attendance** rate is **important** because pupils are more likely to succeed academically when they attend **school** consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a pupils are frequently absent.

What might be the impact of poor attendance?

Struggle to keep up with **school** work. ... Setting good **attendance** habits from an early age, from nursery through **primary school** will also help your child later on in their life where punctuality is a vital expectation of working life..
