Class News

Menabilly Class

Our topic this term is all about under the sea. Our focused book will be 'Rainbow Fish'. The children have looked at this story over the last week and have enjoyed getting to know the plot. Their tasks next week will be to begin thinking about the moral of the story and what is important to us. We will be encouraging the children to write a letter to Rainbow Fish and asking him the different games he likes to play with his friends and try some of these out. In maths we are focusing on adding and taking away and counting how many different colour scales Rainbow Fish has. Porthpean Class

A great start to the summer term. The children have enjoyed spending time in the sun. Please can you ensure your child has a sun hat and sun cream with their names on it as well as a water bottle to refill throughout the day. Next week, we will be continuing our work on seasons in Science. We will be learning about the difference between mammals and fish and focussing on the under sea world.

Pendower Class

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely Easter break. This week we have been completing some really focussed learning- all the children have been so engaged! We have learnt the story of The Giants of St Michaels Mount and created our very own Giants.

Next week we will be looking at more Cornish Myths and tales. We will also be working on our sentence structure and improving boring sentences into exciting ones!

Charlestown Class

Next week we will be continuing with our science focus on muscles and bones. We will start our swimming lessons on Friday and we are also lucky enough to start our sessions with Go Active again. In English we will be using the information we have found out about sea creatures to write a non-chronological report. In maths we will be continuing with work on measures, focusing on millimetres, centimetres and metres. We will also be exploring how we can find the perimeter of a simple shape.

We will be holding an information session for parents about our Falmouth residential next Wednesday from 2:30-3:00 in the hall

Whipsiderry Class

In year 4 next week we will be continuing to read and work with the story of Beowulf. We will be creating our own characters and monsters using a range of descriptive tools. Topic work will also be linked to Beowulf and Viking runes.

In maths we will be working with tenths and hundredths and comparing these to fractions. This will also contain using tenths for measurement.

Science will involve us investigating animal habitats and the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates.

We also have our super exciting visitors joining us on Monday. The Vikings are coming!

Our topic question this term is, "Life: A Roller Coaster?" Children will be planning, designing, mapping and creating their own theme parks. Next week they will focus on advertising to create their own billboard, newspaper and radio adverts to showcase their ideas. We will also be continuing our research into different theme parks around the world and statistics relating to different rides and attractions.

In maths we will begin learning about decimals and how to convert between decimals and fractions.

P.E this term will be every Wednesday with a Plymouth Argyle coach. Some children will also begin swimming every Friday morning- letters for this went out last term

Year 6 have made an excellent start to the summer term. We have been revising a range of areas across all subjects. 
Fowey Festival Awards

This term, children across the school were invited to enter this year's Fowey Festival. A total of 51 children across Year 5 and 6 entered either a short story, a poem or a piece of artwork with the theme of 'birds'. The festival received an amazing 543 entries this year from many local schools as well as individual entries from as far away as Nigeria, Canada, America, Northern Ireland and across England. These included: 145 poems, 107 stories, 275 pictures and 16 models.

We are extremely proud to announce that from Treverbyn Academy, we had two successful entries!

A huge congratulations to **Josie Clemow in Year 6** who came in 2nd place for her entry titled, 'A Christmas Snowy Robin' and to **Jamie-Leigh Brockhill in Year 5**, whose artwork came 'Highly Commended'.
