Menabilly Class

We have had another fantastic week in Reception Class and have even won the attendance award across the whole school!

We have been working very hard with our phonics in Read, Write, Inc, looking at the sounds c, k, u and b. We have also been thinking about how sounds blend together to make words such as cat, pan and dog. We have been thinking about our conservation of number, understanding that when we count a set of objects the amount remains the same no matter how we rearrange them. Porthpean Class

Next week the children will be starting to use part part whole to partition numbers and to make number bonds. Having spent two weeks exploring the story of Goldilocks, the children will now begin to write their own version of the story focussing on the opening, middle and end
