Menabilly Class

During this time the children will be thinking about how to work independently using their previous taught knowledge.

Next week we will continue to look at the weather and will be monitoring our rain gauges throughout the week. We will begin to investigate doubles in maths; learning how we double a number and beginning to recall these. With the phonics screening check coming up soon, we will continue to develop our accuracy for reading real and nonsense words.

A lovely week had in Year 2! We have been doing some really tricky maths looking at filling in missing numbers on a number sentence. We have also been writing instructions to help someone catch

our mythical beasts if they came across them. Next week we will be revising for our quests (SATs) which will be happening the following week.

Next week in English we will be presenting our newspaper reports neatly in addition to doing some spelling, reading and grammar assessments. We will be looking at our location in the world by discussing road names, villages, counties, countries and continents as well as using Google Earth and Google Maps. In science are investigating light and dark and the use of reflective materials. In maths we have been looking at tenths and unit and non unit fractions. We will be using this knowledge to help us identify equivalent fractions. Of course on Friday we will be celebrating the royal wedding with the street party after our swimming session.

Whipsiderry Class

Next week in Year 4 we will be working on instructions. We will continue with our Viking theme while trying to create instructions on how to train a dragon. This will also see us creating our own dragon training equipment that we will try to make through a design technology project. In maths we will look at calculating the area of more complex shapes and using a variety of measurements to do this. Science will see us return to investigating aspects of the human body with our focus being on teeth.
