Menabilly Class

this week we have been reading the traditional tale of Goldilocks and the three bears. We have made story maps, put actions to the story, had different characters and acted out various parts of the story. This has allowed children to become very familiar with the story and supported them in developing important language skills.

In maths we have been talking about time, clocks and reading o'clock and half past times on an analogue clock. Please can you check that your child has a P.E kit and plimsolls that are the correct size. We will be having P.E lessons outside and all children will need to wear plimsolls outside.

Porthpean Class

This week the children have enjoyed learning how to double and share equally in maths. They have also enjoyed finding synonyms for adjectives we have found in our story 'where the wild things are.'

The children are looking forward to the beach trip next week. Please ensure children come to school with appropriate clothing and spare clothes (details can be found on the letter).

Next week, we will continue to build a bank of vocabulary to use in our own writing as well as begin to use adverbs of time to summarise the story.

The children have been working extremely hard on their phonics over the last few weeks. A reminder that the phonics screening check takes place during the week beginning 10th June. Please do ask if you wish to find out how your child is doing in preparation for this assessment.

Pendower Class

This week we have been hard at work at revising all the core maths skills we have learnt this year! We have enjoyed looking back at addition and subtraction and number bonds to 10.

Next week we will be researching different safari animals using google which will help our typing skills. We will also be continuing to revise the four calculations and spotting these in word problems.

In our story telling, we are innovating the story of Jack and the Beanstalk- keep learning the original story at home!

Charlestown Class

Year 3 have been learning how to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator (bottom number). In English they have written descriptive sentences which include powerful verbs, adverbs and similes. Next week children will begin to innovate their own version of The Mousehole Cat.

Next Friday is our annual, whole school beach trip so please ensure children come prepared for what will be a fun day!

Our spelling tests continue to happen every Friday so please support your child in learning these words weekly. Reading records also need to be in daily to show your child's reading efforts at home. Thank you for your continued support with this. Mrs F and Miss Sinclair.

Whipsiderry Class

Another great week this week in year 4!

Next week in English, we will be using the story 'dangle' to inspire our own story ideas. In maths, we will be continuing to focus on money and comparing and estimating with different amounts of money. In topic, we will be looking at Tutankhamun and why he was particularly important.

Just a reminder that children should be reading at home at least 4 times per week. Thanks a lot for your continued support.

Porthcurnow Class

What a lovely week, the whole class have really impressed with their work on adding and subtracting decimals and identifying decimal sequences. Some of the class have been working very hard with Mrs McIntosh on strategies for doubling, multiplying by 4 and 8 and number bonds. They have all worked very hard. We will be continuing with decimal sequences, finding the nth term, multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000.

In English we have been looking at the grammar and punctuation in our Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone story. The children have been identifying and then using direct speech, relative clauses, fronted adverbials and time adverbials. Next week we will be writing our own innovated stories using the plot structure from Harry Potter to help us.

In topic we have been learning about Aztec numbers and their calendar system, drawing comparisons between other number systems we know. Next week we will be looking at the importance of chocolate to the Mayans and Aztecs. We will be planning an investigation into chocolate, taste testing, designing and eventually making chocolates to sell at the summer fair. In science we have been looking at reproduction in mammals, planting all of the donated plants in our butterfly garden and have been amazed by how much the caterpillars have grown already. Don't forget it is our whole school beach trip on Friday, children will need sun cream, hat, change of clothes, sensible shoes, a packed lunch and a big bottle of water.

Pentewan Class

In Year 6 this week, we have been revising all areas of maths, reading and grammar in preparation for the National KS2 Assessment week (SATs) beginning on Monday the 13th May. Remember, children are invited to come into school from 8am Monday to Thursday of SATs week for breakfast and to prepare for the tests with their friends. Please continue to support your children's preparation by using the study guides provided. If your child is not planning on arriving to school early, it is essential that they arrive in school promptly in order to complete the tests alongside the rest of the class. What attendance is Good attendance?

It is vital that pupils attend school, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education. **95%** - 100% (less than 10 days absence in a year) is good attendance. **96%** is the national average attendance rate for a child at primary school.

Why is Good attendance Important?

The **attendance** rate is **important** because pupils are more likely to succeed academically when they attend **school** consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a pupils are frequently absent.

What might be the impact of poor attendance?

Struggle to keep up with **school** work. ... Setting good **attendance** habits from an early age, from nursery through **primary school** will also help your child later on in their life where punctuality is a vital expectation of working life..
