Menabilly Class

This week our focus has been on caterpillars and butterflies. The children were very excited as we have our very own caterpillars in class. We have 5 tiny caterpillars we are watching grow and change into butterflies. We have been reading Eric Carle's *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* and the children have been learning about the lifecycle of a butterfly. This week in maths we have been learning to count in 2's. We have been sorting socks into pairs before counting them in 2's.

Porthpean Class

A super week in Year 1. The children have now completed their phonics checks which will be celebrated tomorrow with a class party (please see the letter sent home yesterday). Next week, we will be writing our own non-fiction information texts on a chosen 'wild thing' and in maths, we will continue our learning on money. The children have been practicing for sports day and are looking forward to Thursday 27th June when sports day will take place.

Pendower Class

We have continued to work really hard this week with our writing. We have written diary entries as if we went on a Safari Adventure. We had to think about lots of different things to include in our writing to make it excellent!

We also have continued to learn to tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes, some of us even to the nearest 5! Please try this at home over the weekend.

Next week we will be designing our own African masks along with learning some instructions on how to catch a giant!

Year 2 will be holding a bake sale on Tuesday 25th June to help raise some money for our Newquay zoo trip. Please get your baking hats on and have some fun to help us along the way. Cakes will be sold at 50p each.

Charlestown Class

In maths this week, Year 3 have been learning to tell the time with lots of practical lessons using clocks. We have been converting time between analogue and digital and using what we have learnt to solve word problems.

In English, children have written wonderfully detailed and descriptive sets of instructions titled, 'How to Tame a...'. They have learnt the features of instructions to ensure

that their own innovated versions include adverbials of time, bullet points and numbered sentences.

Next week we will begin to learn how to write playscripts to tie in with our class trip to the Minack Theatre.

We have had a fun week writing non-chronological reports about our own invented hybrid beasts. We will also be turning our hybrid beasts into a set Top Trump cards, practicing our neatest handwriting. We have been exploring angles, drawing and measuring them with protractors. Moving onto angles within polygons. Next week we will be investigating regular and irregular polygons.

In our Topic work we have been looking at the Maya writing system, creating our own glyph blocks. Next week we will be comparing the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds.
