Menabilly Class

We have been working hard on letter formation this week. We have reviewed the formation of the curly caterpillar letter group - a,o,d,g,f,s,c,q thinking about starting points and the direction these letters are formed. We are hoping to take advantage of the improving weather and begin practicing for sports day. To help with this we would appreciate it if PE kits could be in school everyday.

Porthpean Class

The phonics screening check will take place next week. The children are well prepared for this and are looking forward to showing off their amazing phonics! In writing next week, we will begin our non-fiction writing. The children will learn how to write an information text on one of the wild things from the story 'where the wild things are.' In maths, we will be learning about money. The children will be able to recognise the different coins and will use their knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to add amounts together.

Pendower Class

We have been working really hard on our writing this week and the children have produced some great stories. We have also been looking at reading scales in divisions of twos fives and tens. Next week we will be writing diary entries as if we have been on safari. We will also be completing some art work based on John Dyer.

Charlestown Class

Year 3 have been learning to tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes in maths. They have also been practising their months of the year along with a little trick to remembering how many days are in each month. In English we have been looking at instructions and learning our class set of instructions- 'How to tame Storm Cat'. Earlier in the week we had great fun making biscuits, notebooks and pebbles for our school fair. We were the winning class, making almost £55 for our class. Thank you to everyone who supported us.

Whipsiderry Class

We've had a fantastic first week back this week. In maths, we have been focusing on statistics and have been collecting, presenting and interpreting a range of data. In English, we have learnt a new text about the three little pigs and have been producing a range of writing about this. Next week we will be continuing our work on statistics and will be writing a discussion text about another traditional tale.

Porthcurnow Class

What a lovely return to our final half term of the year. The whole of year 5 worked very hard to make and package our chocolate treats to sell at the summer fair. Thank you to all the parents who came to the fair, sent children in with money and allowed their children to stay behind after school to help on our stalls. The children should all feel very proud of the £44.55 we made. Our butterflies have hatched, the children have all waited very patiently and been very caring of the butterflies. We released the two butterflies that made it to maturity into our butterfly garden today and have been busy doing botanical drawings of butterflies.

We have started learning a new text in English, it is called Dragons - a non-chronological report. Please encourage your children to share it with you. We will be looking in detail at the language in the text next week.

We have been continuing our focus on angles this week, looking at drawing and measuring angles and calculating angles on a line. Next week we will be looking at angles around a point and angles within shapes.

Pentewan Class

This week, Year 6 have really enjoyed creating traditional Greek foods to sell at our Summer fayre! We produced some superb pitta breads and two types of creamy hummus: a plain version and one which included red pepper. The produce sold really well at the fayre, so we will take that as a seal of approval! Alongside this, we have written a non-chronological report about Greece and begun to design our own traditional Greek theatre masks. At the end of the week, we were visited by ambassadors from Poltair school who led a very informative workshop as part of our transition to secondary school. Next week, we are looking forward to investigating the Archimedes Heat Ray in science!
