on Monday 12th November at 10:30am.

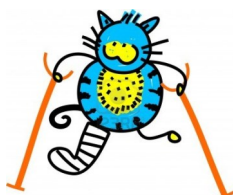

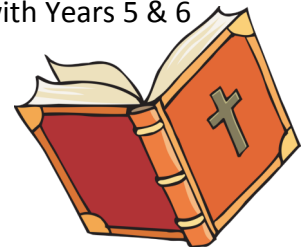
Swimming
