Curriculum

Throughout the year, but especially in September, we will be having a big focus on wellbeing, ensuring that all children are safe and happy in school and that the transition back is a positive experience.

Our topic in Autumn will be the Anglo-Saxons. Our learning will lead us to explore the impact of the Anglo-Saxons and we will be taking part in a range of exciting activities. We will be creating our own timelines, learning about and making ancient pots, as well as travelling through time with our writing. In maths, we will be exploring a range of units, with a focus on number and place value. Our Science learning will be focussing on 'light' and 'sound'.

PE

PE for Walliams class is Monday and Thursday. For Morpurgo PE will be on a Thursday and Friday. The children will be required to wear appropriate Giffard Park PE kit or plain clothes that are Giffard Park colours.

Learning at home

Homework – Continuing from last year, children will be set a piece of Maths or Reading comprehension which will need to be completed each week. This will be set on a Wednesday to be handed in the following Monday. Children will have a homework book to keep this safe.

KIRF - Your child is allocated a different Key Instant Recall Fact target for Maths each half term. These may be personalised to your child and come with a list of suggested activities to complete. They are available on the school's website. KIRFs will be tested in school so it is important to support children in learning these at home.

Reading - Reading supports children in every area of their learning. As a reward for reading every day, children are entered into a school reading raffle each Friday, with the chance to win a new book. On Friday mornings children will need to show their reading records to their teacher to be entered into the raffle. Children can complete the information in their reading records if necessary, but to be entered into the raffle, we require a parent's signature to confirm their record.

Spellings – Weekly spellings will continue to be sent home on a Wednesday, to be tested the following week. It is very important these are practised each week as it promotes strong communication, reading and writing skills.
