

Yellow Class Curriculum Information for Summer 1 2019

Dear Parents/Carers,

This term we are continuing our theme of "Smashing Saxons & Vicious Vikings". We will be learning:

- Literacy - Kennings and poems, stories and explanatory texts
- Numeracy - time, shape, position/direction and measures
- Science- animals including humans
- History- Who were the Saxons? What did they do? Who were the Vikings?
- Music - learning to play the recorders and percussion (Samba instruments). There will be a concert at the end of term 6 to showcase the Samba percussion music. We are also learning songs for our summer performance
- R.E - "How and why do people try to make the world a better place?"

Homework

Independent home learning this term is closely linked to our topic work and our end of year performance. Please could you ensure that you support your child in practising and learning their lines for our end of year production as well as continuing reading with them regularly.

All children are expected to read every night and please make sure that their reading record is initialled/signed. They should be practising their spellings using the "Look Cover Write Check" sheets which will be brought home on a Monday. The children will be tested the following Monday.

Children will be bringing their maths passports home on Wednesday and should be able to say which target they are working towards. There will be a sheet attached to it which corresponds to your child's target so that you can sign when they have been practised at home before being assessed on a weekly basis. To get the best results, little and often is the key!

Children will also be set regular "Mathletics" tasks and homework from "Spag.com". Your child will have their individual log- in details for these websites.
