#### CHILDREN'S SCREEN TIME

There is a new survey by Norton of parents' views on their children's use of mobile technology. Based on responses from 7,000 parents across Europe with children aged 5 to 16, results of the survey include: on average, British children spend three hours a day online; 32% of parents surveyed worried how tablet and phone use may affect their child's mental health; 65% of parents surveyed let their children use gadgets alone in their bedroom.
