We don't forget pupils who have no alternative to the car and each pupil who used car share or park 'n' stride also scores a point. Classes compete against each other to win the coveted Golden Boot Trophy.

**Maths Activities**

Reception	Year 1	Year 2
<p><u>Counting on and back</u> Practise adding and subtracting two numbers up to 10 using objects or finger number line by counting on from the first number or back from the larger number to add and subtract; Eg. <math>7+3=?</math> Start with 7, then count on 3 (ie 7 in your head 8,9,10) so <math>7+3=10</math>. Eg. <math>9-4=?</math> Start with 9, then count back 4 (ie 9 in your head 8,7,6,5) so <math>9-4=5</math>. Extend to adding and subtracting numbers with numbers up to 20 by counting on or back.</p>	<p><u>Comparing Length</u> Practise selecting different objects from around the house to compare in terms of length. Encourage your child to select three or four different objects to put in order from the longest to the shortest. Also practise comparing the heights of objects and ensure that your child understands the difference between measuring length and height.</p>	<p><u>Capacity</u> Look at a small carton of juice or squash. How many millilitres does it hold? Draw the carton and write how much juice it holds. Talk to a partner - is it more or less than a mug full? Take guesses from family or friends. Tip the juice into an ordinary mug and find out who was correct. Repeat with different size mugs and cartons.</p>
