

Outdoor Learning - Launch of the new Woodland Area



We were all very excited to have the official opening of our new Wildlife area in February. The whole school gathered first thing in the morning to watch the ribbon being cut by one of our school governors. During the day the children all then had the opportunity to have a session working alongside an outdoor learning

expert from Surrey Outdoor Learning Development centre (SOLD). Our Reception children had great fun creating their own clay creature using natural materials. Our Year one children experimented with different materials in order to filter some dirty water. Every year two child had success at creating their own spark to make a group fire, which warmed them all up on what was a rather chilly day! The whole school was really buzzing and we are now planning and preparing lots more learning opportunities to make the most of this wonderful natural area.

Personalised progress slips trialled in the Autumn Term, in response to requests from parents for more progress information, have been amended slightly to make them easier to interpret. As before, teachers provide an estimate, based on current attainment, of where children are predicted to be at the end of the school year. As always, these are subject to change as rate of progress for individuals is anything but an exact science. This term, Reception parents will also receive a personalised progress slip for their children.













Reading Audit | Results

Thank you to all those who completed the online reading feedback form. There were 87 responses and, on average, it took 3 minutes to complete. The responses were overwhelmingly positive (4 out of 5 stars) within that 'how much does your child enjoy reading' scored highest (4) and 'how well-resourced' scored the lowest (3.7). Where parents had added comments, these focused on broadly 3 themes:

- Reading to adults in school;
- Quality and quantity of reading books;
- Progress through the colour book bands.

Some parents would like children to read in school to an adult more frequently. In addition to weekly guided reading in groups with the teacher or TA, most children will also read 1:1 to the teacher one week, and the TA the next. We believe this 1:1 time is extremely valuable and we are proud that we continue to hear individual readers as a matter of course (the only school locally who continues this practice). Others who are in need of additional practice will read more regularly. To hear children more regularly would mean sacrificing teaching and lesson time.

Comments regarding quality, breadth and quantity of reading books have been taken on board and will inform our purchasing of new stock with money due to be raised at the next Bounce for Books in March.

Clarification and communication regarding progress through the book bands was mentioned by several respondents. As a result, we will reflect on practice and policy and look at ways we can make this clearer for all.

Please be aware that if parents/carers take their child out of school without authorisation for 5 or more days, they will be liable to receive penalty notices.
