Outdoor PE Kit – an update from Mr Monteith

Following on from my comments on last week's school newsletter, I thought it was important to clarify a few issues that have been brought to my attention. Whilst it does say on our School Prospectus that outdoor P.E. will only take place once the children start Year 3, in my new role as PE lead it is my intention to take more advantage of our outdoor facilities. Following on from the David Campbell taster sessions, I do intend to try and encourage more external providers to come into school and do a number of taster sessions. This may mean, like the David Campbell sessions, that even Key Stage 1 will be expected to do the sessions outside. As a dad myself, I want to encourage my children to be active and explore all of the different sporting opportunities that I hope we will be able to provide over the coming years. What I do not want are for them to be unable to enjoy these opportunities because they are cold. Like with the David Campbell sessions, with the change in the weather on the Friday, the activities were moved inside for our Reception children, but also for some of our Key Stage 2 children. On the previous day, both Year 1 and Year 2 did these activities outside. As stated last week, I do not expect adults to go out and buy brand new clothes and trainers. Ideally, the outdoor kits should be grey, black or navy tracksuit bottoms and tops - not the outrageous illuminous green that I like to wear (©). I do know that P.E. kits were mentioned by my Key Stage 1 colleagues during the Meet the Teacher sessions at the end of last school year, but this this may have been missed by one or two people. I hope this clarifies the school's perspective, but if you do feel the need to discuss with this me further, please ask our wonderful office staff to contact me and I will endeavour to speak to you.

I would also like to say a huge thank you for all the **Aldi stickers**. We have now completed the first poster which will enable us to enter into the prize draw but please do carry on sending your stickers in as we can start another poster which can be used for sports' kit draws.
