

Pobble provides a picture per day with range of ideas for writing – from continuing a story to sentence work and questions. Or the children can simply use the picture as the starting point for a story.

Question time!

What is it that you think the man holds in his hands?
Where did he get them from?
What clues in the story starter tell you something about what the objects are?
Why do you think people misunderstand the man?
How do you think he feels about the objects he possesses?
Where do you think the man lives?

Perfect picture!

Can you draw what might hatch from the magical eggs?

Story starter!

He carries them around with him everywhere. People often misunderstand him. People misunderstand the power he possesses.

A year ago, he found them deep inside a cave he'd stumbled across in Bulgaria, surrounded by a vast pile of ash from a fire that had long gone out but still gently smoking.

To protect them, he stores them in an egg box, which is a great way of deceiving people, but it's only a matter of time before the truth comes out...

Sentence challenge!

Can you write a sentence containing a relative clause, starting with a noun?

E.G. The man, who had walked thousands of miles, guarded the eggs with his life.

The eggs, which he had found in a cave, were beginning to hatch.

Sick sentences!

These sentences are 'sick' and need help to get better. Can you help?

The man carried some things in his hands. They were special. Something was about to happen.

Literacy Shed

The Literacy Shed has some thought provoking videos covering different genres. They come with 'teaching ideas' underneath.



Teaching Ideas

Pause and describe the opening scenes. Ask the pupils to think of reasons why the homes may be derelict. Discuss if they would like to live there. If they didn't want to what would they do? (Move)

Show images of the different houses, do they have different personalities? What do they think as our hero, Blue house, walks past?

Stop the film at different points and write the conversation between characters - for example what are they saying to each other when they are under the bridge in the rain? What do they say to each other at the end when Blue leaves Garage on the beach?

What is Blue thinking when he sees the big White house at 2m 40 secs? Describe this house, maybe like we would describe a beautiful princess.

Write instructions or an explanation detailing how to look after a pet kennel.

Lots of examples of beautiful settings for description.

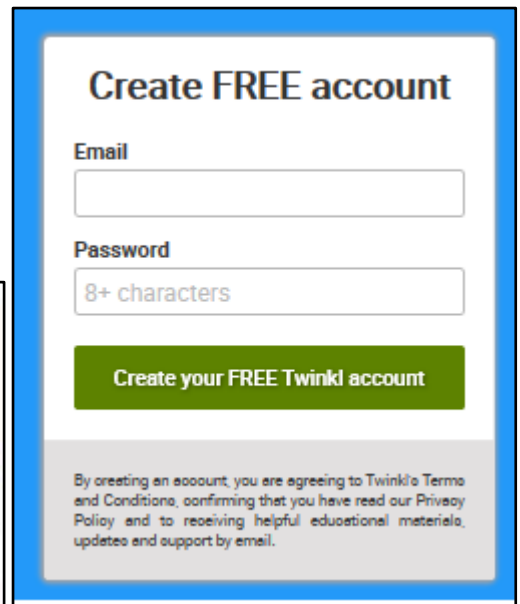
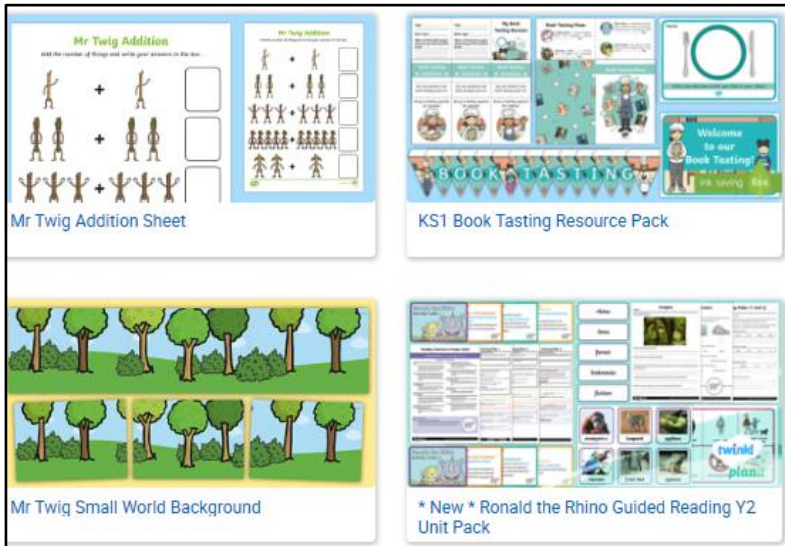
Recount the Tornado sequence, how did it feel? Focus on sights, sounds, feelings, smells etc

The end - Does Blue just leave garage on the beach? Why? Is garage happy?

Write an alternative ending - where does Blue go next? Who does he meet?
