School Dinners

As from September the cost of school dinners (KS2 only) will be £11.50 per week. **Please note that school dinners must be paid for at least one week in advance.** A lot of time is spent chasing late payments of dinner money. Please could I ask that you ensure you are always in credit and not to wait until you receive a reminder. **We shall be unable to provide a school lunch for those children with an outstanding balance.** You will be able to keep track of balances on the **ParentPay system** at any time. School Uniform

Just a few gentle reminders about school uniform as many of you will probably be purchasing new uniform for the Autumn Term.

Should you be considering buying a COAT the expected colours are plain black, navy or bottle green. Girls are expected to wear bottle green or grey tights/white or grey socks while boys wear grey socks.

All children need sensible school shoes. Please do not allow your child to persuade you to buy other styles by telling you "all their friends have them"!

Fashion hair cuts must be grown out before term commences. I would like to point out that all long hair must be tied and clipped back while at school. This applies to both boys and girls, and will help towards our efforts of keeping head lice at bay.

Wearing the correct school uniform with pride is one of our school codes so please do help us to support your child by ensuring they wear a full and proper uniform, **including the tie!** As I am sure you will appreciate, it helps to develop self-discipline and a sense of community.
