Follow your Teacher and classmates out of the classroom door and then outside.

Walk quietly.

Do not run or yell.



Wait where the Teacher tells you to wait. This is not play time. Your Teacher will call the Register.



The alarm will stop ringing when everyone is out of the building.



When the Teacher says it is ok to go back into the school, follow your classmates back inside.



Remember it is just practice. Walk quickly and quietly and always do what the Teacher says.
