

Have fun making up characters and take some photos if you have a camera!





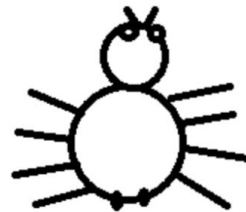
