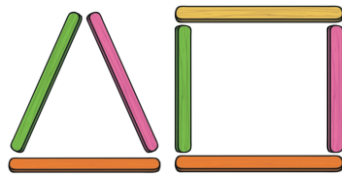
Sports Day!

A sack	A strong shopping bag (with handles)
A tie	A piece of string, ribbon, large hair scrunchie



Construction Challenge!

Using any construction materials (including junk modeling) can you build one of the following?

Materials

Thick blue paper

Scissors

Sharpie marker

Outdoor tape

Laminator (optional)



Instructions

You can either get your children involved in cutting out the puddles and writing numbers on or you can do this yourself.

The numbers you focus on will depend on the age of your children, 1-10 is a good place to start with little ones!

- Lay all the puddles out, sticking them to the ground with tape to stop them from blowing away. Allow ample space between them for your children to jump. It's good to do this activity outside but you can play it inside if it's wet.
- Get your children to jump from number to number in order from 1-10, counting out loud as they go.
- If they find this easy, get them to count backwards from 10-1
- If all your children are completing this activity with ease move to the extension activity

Extension Activity

Make up different facts and stories asking children to jump to the correct answer.

For example:

- If Jane has 3 cookies and picks up 1 more how many will she have?
- If there are 8 clouds in the sky and 2 disappear how many will be left?

Base the questions on the age and ability of your children.
