# TARGET 2: Personal Development, Behaviour and Welfare

- 1. To continue to ensure teaching is the best it can be consistently providing a 100% profile of good+ teaching with  $\frac{1}{2}$  the lessons containing outstanding features across ALL subjects. **SLT**
- Subject leaders to be more effective in leading their subjects across the school e.g. identifying under-performance, monitoring feedback and quality of work and ensuring assessment procedures are in place. - Subject Leaders
