On July 16, The Telegraph & Argus celebrates 150 years of reporting the news and to mark it, we are searching for budding writers/artists from across Bradford and District to write or draw a picture about a news story to help us celebrate 150 years of reporting the news.

The competition is open to school children aged between 6 and 16, from across the District, with three age categories: 6-9, 10-13 and 14-16.

You can write or draw a picture about any news story that's of interest to you, either about a current event or an event that's happened within the last 150 years. It can be about a national event with local relevance, something that happened in Bradford or something that is important to you, your school or where you live. You can even do both, write a story and illustrate it with a picture..

The closing date for getting your entries in to us is June 29, 2018

After the closing date, a panel of judges headed by T&A Editor, Nigel Burton will select the best from each age category. Each winner will receive £50 worth of national book tokens and will feature, along with a selection of the best entries from each of the age categories, in a special 150th feature that will appear in the T&A in July.

We look forward to receiving your contributions.

HOW TO ENTER:

All you have to do is write a news report of up to 300 words (with or without an illustration) and send it to us, along with the entry form below, to The T&A 150th News Story competition, Hall Ings, Bradford, BD1 1JR. Alternatively, you can enter a picture about a news story, no bigger than A4 size, using the entry form to describe what story you are illustrating.

Entries can also be handed in at the T&A Office on Hall Ings, Bradford..

Your entry must reach us by June 29, 2018.

RULES: The children of employees of Newsquest (Bradford) and their immediate families are not eligible to enter; the qualifying date for the age categories is the entrant's age at the closing date. The entries must be signed by an adult and all entrants must be willing to take part in publicity in connection with the competition. The judges' decision is final and not correspondence will be entered into. Unfortunately we are not able to return any of the entries.
