## **Recovery Curriculum**

Over the coming weeks, all class teachers will be planning and teaching a curriculum which best meets the needs of their pupils on their return to school. This will include a heavier focus on Reading and Maths, and an increased emphasis on PSHE with a focus on Mental Health issues. Next week, assessments will be taken by pupils in Reading, Maths, and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling. These assessments will help teachers to identify any learning gaps which the children may have, and this information will help the teachers to plan an effective catch up curriculum. Our aim is to provide a broad and balanced curriculum across as many subject areas as possible. However, teachers have been asked to prioritise the key areas of Reading and Maths initially, and this may result in some areas of the curriculum not being taught until later in the school year.

This week, our teaching assistants have received training in the use of a benchmarking scheme for reading. They are currently carrying out benchmarking assessments on children throughout the school, so that we can identify quickly any pupils who require additional support in this area.

In the Summer term, we will also be looking to provide some additional support for pupils and classes where it is needed most.

## **Whole School Attendance**

Now that the school is fully reopen to all pupils, and with the potential disruption to children's learning caused by Lockdown, it is more important than ever for children to attend school every day. Whole school attendance for this week has been 97.8% which is very impressive! I will be monitoring the attendance of every pupil from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March and contacting directly the parents of pupils for whom attendance becomes a concern. Now that we are fully reopen, we will be looking to resume a number of our attendance incentives, such as High Attendance certificates (97%+), Five for a Fiver (all children who attend school for a week enter a prize draw for a £5 note!) and end of term prize draws for even bigger prizes such as a Kindle Fire. Thank you for your support.

## **Year 5 Bikeability Workshops**

Year 5 pupils have the opportunity to take part in Bikeability workshops throughout the week beginning Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> March.
