Year 5 Mathematics Curriculum Overview

Number and Place Value	Addition and Subtraction	Multiplication and Division	Fractions, Decimals, Percentages and Ratio
<p>I know that 10 tenths 100 hundredths are equivalent to one 1 and that 1 is ten times the size of one tenth and 100 times the size of one hundredth. I can work out how many hundreds there are in four digit multiples of 100. (KPI1)</p> <p>I can read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1 000 000 and determine the value of each digit (KPI2)</p> <p>I can count forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1 000 000</p> <p>I can recognise the place value of each digit in numbers with up to two decimal places. (KPI3)</p> <p>I can read, write, order and compare numbers with up to three decimal places (KPI4)</p> <p>I can interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative whole numbers, including through zero (KPI5)</p> <p>I can round any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10 000 and 100 000 (KPI6)</p> <p>I can solve number problems and practical problems that involve all of the above</p> <p>I can read Roman numerals to 1000 (M) and recognise years written in Roman numerals.</p>	<p>I can add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods (columnar addition and subtraction) (KPI7)</p> <p>I can add and subtract numbers mentally with increasingly large numbers</p> <p>I can mentally add two decimal numbers to one decimal place.</p> <p>I can use rounding to check answers to calculations and determine, in the context of a problem, levels of accuracy</p> <p>I can solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why.</p>	<p>I can divide 1 into 2,4,5 and 10 equal parts. (KPI8)</p> <p>I can identify multiples and factors, including finding all factor pairs of a number, and common factors of two numbers</p> <p>I know and use the vocabulary of prime numbers, prime factors and composite (non-prime) numbers</p> <p>I can establish whether a number up to 100 is prime and recall prime numbers up to 19 (KPI9)</p> <p>I can multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for two-digit numbers (KPI10)</p> <p>I can multiply and divide numbers mentally drawing upon known facts</p> <p>I can divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders appropriately for the context (KPI11)</p> <p>I can multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100 and 1000 (KPI12)</p> <p>I can recognise and use square numbers and cube numbers and the notation for squared (²) and cubed (³) (KPI13)</p> <p>I can solve problems involving multiplication and division including using their knowledge of factors and multiples squares and cubes</p> <p>I can solve problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and a combination of these, including understanding the meaning of the equals sign</p> <p>I can solve problems involving multiplication and division, including scaling by simple fractions and problems involving simple rates.</p>	<p>I can compare and order fractions whose denominators are all multiples of the same number</p> <p>I can identify, name and write equivalent fractions of a given fraction, represented visually, including tenths and hundredths (KPI14)</p> <p>I can recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert from one form to the other and write mathematical statements > 1 as a mixed number [for example, two-fifths + four-fifths = six fifths = 1 and 1-fifth (KPI15)</p> <p>I can add and subtract fractions with the same denominator and denominators that are multiples of the same number (KPI16)</p> <p>I can multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers, supported by materials and diagrams</p> <p>I can read and write decimal numbers as fractions [for example, 0.71 = 71 hundredths</p> <p>I can recognise and use thousandths and relate them to tenths, hundredths and decimal equivalents (KPI17)</p> <p>I can round decimals with two decimal places to the nearest whole number and to one decimal place(KPI18)</p> <p>I can solve problems involving number up to three decimal places</p> <p>I can recognise the per cent symbol (%) and understand that per cent relates to 'number of parts per hundred', and write percentages as a fraction with denominator 100, and as a decimal (KPI19)</p> <p>I can solve problems which require knowing percentage and decimal equivalents of half, quarter, fifth, two fifths and four fifths and those fractions with a denominator of a multiple of 10 or 25.</p>

Measurement	Shapes and Space	Statistics
<p>I can convert between different units of metric measure (for example, kilometre and metre; centimetre and metre; centimetre and millimetre; gram and kilogram; litre and millilitre) (KPI20)</p> <p>I can understand and use approximate equivalences between metric units and common imperial units such as inches, pounds and pints</p> <p>I can measure and calculate the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes in centimetres and metres</p> <p>I can calculate and compare the area of rectangles (including squares), and including using standard units, square centimetres (cm²) and square metres (m²) and estimate the area of irregular shapes (KPI21)</p> <p>I can estimate volume [for example, using 1 cm³ blocks to build cuboids (including cubes)] and capacity [for example, using water]</p> <p>I can solve problems involving converting between units of time</p> <p>I can use all four operations to solve problems involving measure using decimal notation, including scaling.</p>	<p>I can identify 3-D shapes, including cubes and other cuboids, from 2-D representations</p> <p>I know angles are measured in degrees: estimate and compare acute, obtuse and reflex angles (KPI22)</p> <p>I can draw given angles, and measure them in degrees (o) (KPI23)</p> <p>I can identify angles at a point and one whole turn (total 360o) (KPI24)</p> <p>I can identify angles at a point on a straight line and half a turn (KPI25)</p> <p>I can identify other multiples of 90o</p> <p>I can use the properties of rectangles to deduce related facts and find missing lengths and angles</p> <p>I can distinguish between regular and irregular polygons based on reasoning about equal sides and angles.</p> <p>I can identify, describe and represent the position of a shape following a reflection or translation, using the appropriate language, and know that the shape has not changed.</p>	<p>I can solve comparison, sum and difference problems using information presented in a line graph</p> <p>I can complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.</p>
