Continuous study throughout the year following the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum (2017/2018)

The Prime areas of learning are as follows:

Communication and Language	Listening to, learning and retelling stories throughout the year. Listening, talking and asking questions
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	Becoming independent and confident. Learning to express and manage feelings and behaviour. Forming good relationships and playing co-operatively.
Physical Development	PE taught through Real PE programme. Large scale physical activities e.g. walking in the local environment, bike riding, apparatus and dance. Developing fine motor skills through handling equipment and tools such as scissors and pencils Understanding how to keep healthy and safe.

The Specific areas of learning are as follows:

Literacy -	Reading and writing taught through the Read Write Inc. programme. Enhanced through topic based activities.
Mathematics -	Mathematics taught through the Maths, Makes Sense programme. Learning about; numbers 0-20, addition, subtraction, 2D/3D shape, measure and position.
Understanding the World	Learning about the world around us and our place in it. Investigating, questioning and exploring. Using technology such as cameras, iPads and computers.
Expressive Arts and Design	Exploring and using different media and materials. Learning to represent own ideas and thoughts through art, design, dance, music and role-play.

The Characteristics of Effective Learning are at the heart of our YF daily teaching and learning;

Playing and Exploring, Active Learning, Creating and Thinking Critically.
Superhero Challenge Time and Plan, Do and Review enable our children to use and apply the skills they have learnt.

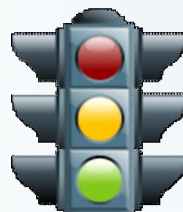
Autumn Term Topic

St. Piran's Day, and other traditional celebration days.

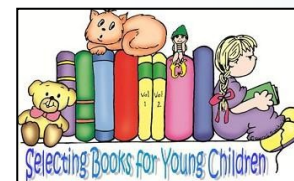
Summer Term Topic
