

Sports Premium Funding 2016 -17 St Kew CP School

The school has been in receipt of additional government funding specified as Sport Premium since its introduction in September 2013. We will receive £8000 plus £5 per child on roll. This extra funding must be spent on Physical Education and school sport. As a school we will be held accountable for how we use the additional funding and from April 2014 we are required to publish online information regarding how we have used the sports premium and the impact it has made. We aim to utilise this extra funding to improve all aspects of physical activity: maximising pupil progress, increasing participation in sport, professional development of staff and to help all our pupils develop healthy lifestyles and positive attitudes towards Physical Education.

- **Improving the teaching of PE and the learning experience for all pupils**
- **Increasing participation in local festivals and competitions**
- **Supporting Gifted and Talented Pupils in developing their skills**

- **Enhancing the confidence of Pupil Premium children to participate in PE and sports**
- **Increasing access to a wide variety of sports for all pupils**
- **Creating a lifelong habit of physical activity**
