


<p>English Our class text will be <i>The Wild Girl</i>, by Chris Wormell.</p> <p>We will use this text to create character descriptions as well as diary entries to describe the man's wishes and dreams.</p> <p>The illustrator, Chris Wormell, has created incredibly rich pictures, so we are starting off our topic by using art to get the children to learn and be inspired by the story. Also, we will be predicting what might happen in our story.</p> <p>We will also spend a week focusing on poetry and two weeks on Non-fiction writing.</p> <p>We will learn the following skills to enrich our writing: using commas in lists, using expanded noun phrases, character descriptions using a mixture of simple and compound sentences and using apostrophes for possession. We will be working on our dictionary skills to encourage the children's spelling and independence in class.</p>	<p>Maths In Maths this term we will be covering the following skills: Place Value: Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations. Find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number. Recognise the place of each digit in a three-digit number. Compare and order numbers to 100. Read and write numbers up to 1,000 in numerals and words. Count from zero in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100. Addition and subtraction: Add and subtract numbers mentally, including a three-digit number and ones; a three-digit number and tens and a three-digit number and 100's. Add and subtract numbers with up to three digits, using formal written methods of column addition and subtraction. Estimate the answer to a calculation and use inverse operations to check answers. Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value and more complex addition and subtraction.</p>	<p>Science Our focus in science is Rocks and Soils.</p> <p>We will be learning: About different types of rocks. Grouping rocks. All about fossils. Soil formation. Soil permeability.</p>  <p>The children will also be learning about Mary Anning who was a fossil collector. Famous scientists came to visit her to see the fossils that she found.</p>  		
<p>History We will be learning all about the Stone Age in Britain (including the Stone, Bronze and Iron ages). We will look at significant people from this period, settlements, homes and diet. We will look at significant structures and settlements including Stonehenge and Skara Brae. We will place these events on a timeline to be built on as the term's progress.</p>	<p>Computing We will be looking at Online Safety in Term 1. We will learn how to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stay safe online and who to talk to if there is a problem. Protect our personal information. Act if someone is unkind to them online and the consequences that online behaviour can have. Understand the difference between communicating in person and online. 	<p>Art/Design We will be blending paint to create a variety of Stone Age artwork- including mixed media Stonehenge art, cave paintings and developing some sketching skills.</p> <p>Music Listening- the children will be listening and collecting sounds from around the school. We will be listening to various songs to identify examples of tempo, rhythm, and tone. We will use music to inspire our art and writing.</p>	<p>RE What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today? Crown Value We understand how to lead physically and mentally healthy lives. PSHE Jigsaw topic: Being me in my world.</p>	<p>PE This will occur each Tuesday and Thursday (Tuesday with me and Thursday with Mr Smith). We will learn about Hockey as an invasion game, developing skills including dribbling, shooting, passing and positional sense through a variety of individual and small sided games.</p>
