Dear Parents,

Next week we wish all of our wonderful Year 6 children good luck as they undertake their SATS tests. These are the same tests that all 10 and 11 year olds will be undertaking throughout the country. These tests are used to benchmark the progress that our children are making as they have progressed through their Primary school years. They undertake papers in 3 subjects (reading, grammar and maths) and I thought I would give you an example of some of the questions that have been in past papers. Grammar example: Rewrite the underlined verb in the sentence below so it is in the present progressive. I taught my sister to skateboard. Spelling: inconceivable. Maths: The length of a day on Earth is 24 hours. The length of a day on Mercury is $58 \frac{2}{3}$ times the length of a day on Earth. What is the length of a day on Mercury, in hours?
