Local Awareness	Self Reliance
<p>This needs to be an independent project about some aspect of Wirral Life. The project needs to be of the best quality that each individual can produce. It should include photos, drawings, newspaper cuttings, interviews etc.</p> <p>Eg. Fred's project was excellent. It had been well researched and the many photographs of the animals were spectacular. He clearly enjoyed his visit.</p>	<p>Pupils need to demonstrate an increase in personal independence appropriate to their age and ability</p> <p>Parents can set the task (approved by teacher)</p> <p>This cannot be general household tasks (eg. Dishwashing)</p> <p>Eg. Fred gets his uniform out each night ready for school and he packs all the things he needs for the next day in to his school bag before having his tea</p> <p>Joyce makes her own packed lunch each morning, this consists of a ham sandwich, bottle of juice, sliced grapes and a yoghurt</p>

Physical Achievement	Service to others
<p>This must be a measurable activity and progress must be mentioned in a comment. The activity need to be over a reasonable period of time for progress to be made.</p> <p>Eg. Fred has been working on his level 4 swimming badge. He has attended weekly swimming lessons and had extra practise at the weekend. He has now been awarded level 4</p> <p>Joyce has been developing her skills as a goal keeper for her local team. She has attended weekly training sessions and has played in goal during the last three matches saving a number of goals and only conceding two.</p>	<p>This activity should be appropriate to the age and ability of the pupil. It should make demands (in terms of time and skill etc) on the awardee. It does not include "help at home." The service should be needed by the individual/ group/ charity over a period of time. No door to door collecting or sponsorship is allowed.</p> <p>Eg. Fred has been helping me to take my bins out each week. I am 76 years old and suffer from severe arthritis in my hands which makes it quite difficult for me to move the bins. Without this help I would really struggle each week.</p> <p>Joyce has sorted her clothes and toys out and held a garden sale to raise money for Zoe's Place. She has raised £34.50. the remaining clothes and toys were donated to the Barnado's shop for them to sell.</p>

<p>Wise Use of Leisure Project:</p> <p>A commitment to a leisure activity over a period of time. The aim is to introduce a long term hobby or leisure activity. The comments need to be made by and signed by the activity leader/ coach/ instructor etc.</p> <p>Suggested activities include: Regular visits to the library, Brownies, horse riding, football team, dancing, musical instrument, choir etc.</p> <p>Fred attends music lessons once a week. He is learning to play the guitar. At home he practices for about 20 minutes each day. He can play simple tunes, reading the music and keeping to the beat.</p> <p>Joyce attends Brownies each week. She has been working on her Brownie badges and we recently planned a Brownie camp which she has attended.</p>
