Mr McCann's Class have started their new topic 'Space' in Science. They will be learning all about the Solar System and Day and Night. They had a Pre-Learning activity to complete about what they already knew

about Space and then they had the opportunity to write down any question about what they would like to learn about. They then watched a short video about the planets that make up our solar system.

We then went into the hall and made The Solar System using our bodies and balloons as the planets, the sun and the moons. The children moved and spun around the sun to model how the planets orbited the sun.

In Mrs Hollis Class this week the children have been learning their colours in French. The children sang 'The Rainbow Song' in French and then practised

their pronunciation. Once they could remember most of the names they got into pairs and played colour bingo, picking cards and saying the colour in French and matching it to the written French word. They did very well.



In Mrs Walker's Class this week the children have been learning that God made everything. Foundation 1&2 learnt a new song and put actions to it, that talks about God make the sea and the birds and the bees and making us. The children really enjoyed the song and during busy time, they drew pictures of things that God had made. They were beautiful

This week, in year 6 we have re-launched the Reading Challenge competition after its success last year.

We are lucky to have a variety of 10 different books for the children to take home one at a time.

The challenge is for children to have read all 10 books by the end of the school year.

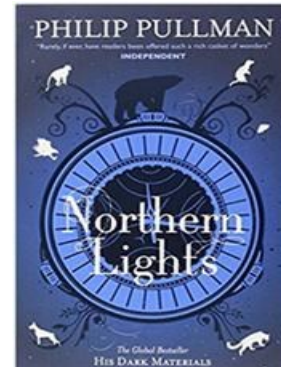
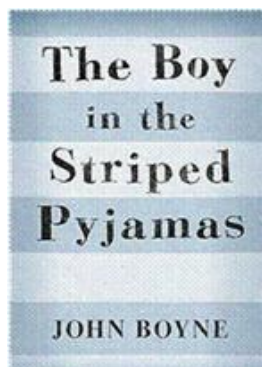
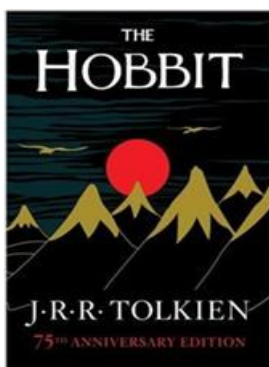
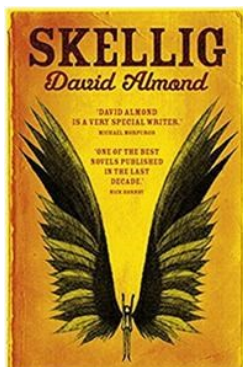
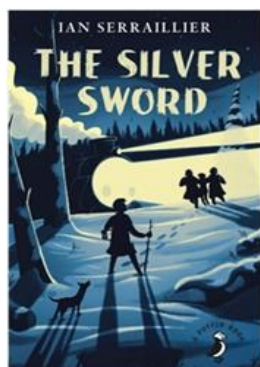
Once children have completed a book, they will be required to complete a 'follow-up' task in their Reading journal. When your child has completed their 'follow-up' task, they should bring it into school to be checked by Mrs Boekweit-Hughes and Miss Morgan before starting the next book in the challenge. For each book and 'follow-up' task your child completes, they'll receive a certificate.

After completing 5 books, your child will receive a special Reading Challenge medal. If your child completes all ten Reading Challenge books, they'll

receive a very special grand prize at the end of the year!

They'll also be awarded with a school Reading Ambassador badge to wear with pride. As this scheme is considered an extra challenge, your child will also be provided with a separate home reading book to read alongside it. Children should aim to read at home 5 times per week and adults will be required to sign and date in home reading records so that teachers can monitor the progress of your child's reading on a regular basis.

We cannot stress enough the importance of Reading every evening. Sitting with your child, listening to them read and discussing plot and character is invaluable. Reading is a key skill which underpins every subject in the curriculum.

Turning Concern into Action

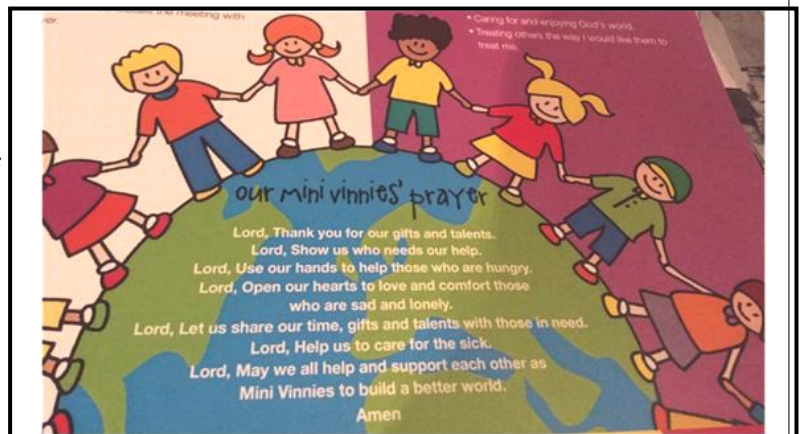
This year St Joseph's Primary School have worked with the parish St Vincent de Paul (SVP) adult group and have decided to set up our own "Mini Vinnies".
