What bullying is

Bullying is where people are unkind to others multiple times.

A pattern of unkind behaviour on separate occasions

When somebody is physically or verbally hurting somebody else on several occasions.

If you are being bullied

Children should be encouraged to speak out if they are being bullied. This could be with a friend at first, but a teacher should be told also.

If a child feels like they have no friends to speak to, they should seek out a member of the school council who will assist them in speaking to an adult.

Calm room during lunch time.

Bullying worry box that is kept in the school office

Feelings buckets as we leave school at the end of the day

If you feel like somebody is being unkind, please speak to a friend and adult rather than reacting.

School action for children who are bullying

Conversation with the child

Speak to parents

Lunch time isolation to reflect

Sorry letter – How you will improve in the future

Sequence of consequences if bullying does not stop

Rewards for children who are seen to be helping to stop bullying

Older children in the school are responsible to ensure they are not bullying so younger children in Hillcrest do not copy this.
