





Holy Thursday

One of the heart-shaping lessons Jesus used with His disciples was foot washing (John 13:4-17). Just before the Passover Festival, and before Judas fled to carry out his betrayal of Jesus, Jesus offered this truly profound lesson. Foot washing was customarily a servant's job. That evening there were no servants present. The

dusty, dirty, travel-worn feet of the sandaled men needed washing. Jesus didn't wait for someone else to address the need. With love, and the desire to teach by example, He washed the disciples' feet. May we too 'wash the feet' of others: maybe a smile to a stranger, an arm to the elderly, a word of kindness to a sad face. These small gestures can change our community.
