# HOMework Year 6

*Helping your child  
to learn at home*

*In the lead up to SATs, Year 6 children  
will receive additional homework and  
revision activities to complete.*



## READING

For children in Year 6, it is important that they continue to read regularly at home. We recommend that the children read everyday for 20-30 minutes. It is important that the children develop a 'reading stamina' so that they are prepared for the longer,

more demanding texts of SATs and secondary school.

If your child is a fluent reader then they will be able to read independently and record it themselves in their reading diaries. If your child is still developing the skills of reading, it is recommended that an adult or older sibling reads with them to assist their development and record progress in their reading diary.

Although children are allocated a reading book from school, we are happy for them to read from other sources at home and record in their reading diary (including their own books, comics, children's newspapers, e-books etc).

## SPELLING

The National Curriculum identifies key words which the children should know. There is a list for children in Year 3 and 4, and a list for children in Year 5 and 6. We recommend that children spend some time each week learning these spellings at home. It is very important that children in Year 6 are spelling these words correctly in their writing. You can find the lists on the middle pages of this booklet. In class, the children learn a range of spelling patterns and spelling rules from the National Curriculum - you may find that your class teacher sometimes sends home additional spellings, to support this teaching, if necessary.



i am learning

All of the children in Year 4, 5 and 6 have access to I AM LEARNING. This is a games based revision and assessment system for all subjects which is accessed via

The school pays for the children to have access and they can use any device which has access to the web.

## MATHS

**Times tables** are an essential aspect of the Key Stage 2 Mathematics Curriculum. By the end of Year 4, it is expected that all children will 'have memorised their multiplication tables up to and including the 12 multiplication table', which means that children need to know, without having to spend time working out, all of the times tables up to 12x12. It is really important that children spend time each week, preferably every day, learning their times tables. Children who do not know their times tables can find that they struggle more with their class work, as so much of the Year 6 National Curriculum and SATs content relies on the children having instant recall of these number facts. The back page of this booklet contains a list of all of the times tables the children need to know.

**Telling the time** is an area where parents and carers can easily help their children. The children need to be able to tell the time in analogue and digital, 12 and 24 hour.



**Money** is another good example. Children need to be familiar with all of the coins and notes in use and able to calculate totals and change. Much of this should be achieved mentally (for simple calculations) without the need for a written calculation. Children also need to be able to convert amounts between pence and pounds e.g. £3.87 is 387p and vice versa and know different ways for creating amounts of money.
