



## PE and Sport Premium 2020 - 2021

The premium must be spent by schools on making additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

Objectives –

- to improve the provision of physical education at Petworth CofE Primary School during lessons
- to improve the extra-curricular activities provided and competitive intra and inter sport
- to develop Play Leaders
- to engage reluctant participants
- To improve teaching of P.E. at Petworth CofE Primary School by raising the confidence and expertise of class teachers
- To promote children’s experience of, and confidence with, the outdoor environment

<p>Purchase:-</p> <p>To ensure that all lessons and clubs have all the resources needed to be successful. Purchase school equipment to add to our school’s diverse P.E. Curriculum including tablets to record performances and results.</p> <p>To purchase affiliation to Midhurst Rother College P.E. initiatives and Youth Sport Trust</p> <p>Sports news board, website, newsletter, social media will be publicised and maintained throughout the year and updated to show the increase in sports events and activities. <p>Top Up Swimming - To ensure that by the end of KS2 more children (75%) are able to swim 25 meters.</p> <p>Children receive top-up swimming sessions (year six) - most children will be able to swim 25 meters by the time they leave key stage two (including travel costs).</p>	<p>£900</p>	<p>Not happened and will now take place for next academic year. 59% of children in year six can swim 25m.</p>

<p>To evaluate what we are doing in school and what we need to include ensuring we meet the criteria set for the School Games Mark (subject release time).</p> <p>To organise intra (six tournaments) / inter competitions for our children with some based on Olympic Sports and Sports Mark e.g. football, netball tournaments, cross country (dependent on coronavirus restrictions).</p> <p>For children to be able to attend sports fixtures regularly (travel costs, teacher release).</p> <p>To organise a Petworth Area Schools Olympic event</p>	<p>£200</p> <p>£2400</p> <p>£1400</p>	<p>Intra school competitions completed each half-term throughout the year, although not lead by year six children as we have not mixed bubbles. Sports included: cross country, seated volleyball and handball.</p> <p>Whole school Olympic Week completed where the children participated in tennis, hockey, blind football, athletics, handball, seated volleyball and dance. The children created films and shared their experiences throughout the week.</p> <p>Children have used our minibus to attend sporting fixtures.</p>
<p>To further embed our 'Golden Mile' – each class to complete at least twice a week.</p> <p>To continue to embed a girls football club and pay for a coach for an after-school club for two terms.</p>	<p>£300</p> <p>£800</p>	<p>Children have not completed twice a week, however all classes have completed three times per fortnight.</p> <p>Club did not happen due to not wanting to mix bubbles. Will look to revisit in Autumn 2021.</p>

To raise the confidence of teaching and improve the learning opportunities for the children.</p> <p>Support from dance coach expert</p>	<p>£2340</p> <p>£1560</p>	<p>Six of eight teachers have worked with a sports coach as part of our CPD. In addition, two teachers have worked with another P.E. teacher as part of their CPD.</p> <p>Four teachers worked with Dance coach during the Autumn Term.</p>
